

Spanish From Scratch Demo Lesson

Simplified grammar notes:

Nouns are the names of people places and things. Articles precede nouns, they specify or clarify the gender and number of nouns. Adjectives describe nouns.

They all have to match in gender and number.

Use el before masculine nouns Use la before feminine nouns

Most masculine words end in o and most feminine words end in a, but there are lots of exceptions. (We'll talk about the exception on a different lesson in the course).

The -e ending usually works for both feminine and masculine form.

The verb to be in the third person singular is "es".

- 1. Print the flashcards, cut them out, and write the Spanish meaning on the other side. That way you'll start getting used to the correct spelling.
- 2. Watch the video and follow the instructions. Remember to answer the questions out loud, it is important to practice pronunciación.
